SOUTH FLORIDA Miami and Fort Lauderdale draw the rich, the famous, and the trendy. Nightlife abounds, but South Beach is also a historic district, a people-watching haven, and a beach-lover's dream.

Arts & Culture Drive up Miami Beach to see wonderful examples of early 20th-century architecture. Visit the Norton Museum of Art in Palm Beach, boasting work by American artists Hopper, O'Keefe, and Pollock. And don't leave Miami without seeing the fabulous New World Symphony at the Frank Gehry-designed New World Center.

Fab Food Stop by Miami's Xixon, for authentic Spanish fare. Dine in or take some bocadillo (sandwiches) filled with Serrano ham and salty Manchego cheese to-go for a perfect picnic. On Española Way in Miami, Tapas & Tintos is the place to go for delectable tapas.



Shopping Find that extra-special something along the newly renovated Worth Avenue in Palm Beach. Dubbed the Rodeo Drive of the East Coast, this palm-tree-lined strip offers an unforgettable shopping experience amid Old World-style architecture and design.



→ Off the Beaten Path South Florida boasts a variety of preserved nature areas that deserve exploring: Corkscrew Swamp Sanctuary, the Fakahatchee Strand Preserve State Park, Ding Darling National Wildlife Refuge, and Jonathan Dickinson State Park.



Experience the sophisticated waterfront retreat and cultural destination that is **The Palm Beaches & Boca Raton**. Take in world-class shows and exhibitions at the area's hundreds of theaters, indoor and outdoor performance spaces, and art centers; explore the city's rich history at the Flagler Museum; sample the culinary masterworks of celebrity chef-owned restaurants; and shop trendy downtown districts. Fish or dive in the Gulf Stream-warmed waters, and soak up the sunshine on 47 miles of pristine beaches. CENTRAL FLORIDA At the heart of the Sunshine State, Central Florida is renowned for its fabulous weather and over-the-top theme parks—but there are plenty of other reasons this region is known as "The Vacation Capital of the World."





- Arts & Culture View the fine collection of Louis Comfort Tiffany glass at the Charles Hosmer Morse Museum of American Art in Winter Park. Explore the Munn Park Historic District in the charming town of Lakeland. And don't miss the impressive collection of Frank Lloyd Wright architecture at Florida Southern College.
- Fab Food Cephas' Hot Shop has been a favorite stop in Tampa's Ybor City for more than 30 years, serving up Jamaican fare such as curried goat or jerk chicken and, for the vegan, fresh vegetables or an Aloe Vera shake. For steaming build-yourown gourmet pies, head to Satchel's Pizza in Gainesville, said to have the best pizza on Florida's east coast.
- Shopping Shop till you drop at Polk County's newest open-air shopping plaza, Lakeside Village in Lakeland, which brims with upscale boutiques, specialty shops, restaurants, and movie theaters.
- Off the Beaten Path Cut through the wet wilderness on a swamp buggy or airboat (watch for alligators) in Kissimmee, or have "Lunch with an Astronaut" at Kennedy Space Center in Cape Canaveral (be sure to book ahead).





A warm, casual world filled with fabulous al fresco dining, outlet shopping, natural wonders, and cool culture, **Greater Fort Lauderdale** is a relaxing, refreshing getaway. Warm your toes on 23 miles of golden, sun-kissed beaches—an easy walk from many of the city's hotels, restaurants, and activities; indulge in a spa day or a day cruise; explore acclaimed art, science, and history exhibits in area museums; and find that perfect something along Las Olas Boulevard, also known as "style mile," lined with boutiques, restaurants, lively lounges, and cafés. *Learn more at* **sunny.org**

NORTHWEST FLORIDA Spanning Pensacola east to Tallahassee, Northwest Florida is renowned for its stunning white sand beaches, emerald waters, and distinctly Southern towns full of history and beauty.





- Arts & Culture Stroll through downtown Pensacola, Florida's oldest European settlement, where you can try glass-blowing at the Belmont Arts Center or catch a show at the Spanish Baroquestyle Saenger Theatre, open since 1925. Head to Tallahassee to experience the Bradfordville Blues Club, which has been playing the blues for more than 50 years.
- Fab Food Try the famous Bay Jewels Benedict at Caroline's River Dining in Apalachicola for a perfectly sublime breakfast—eggs with shrimp, oysters, or grouper served with a buttermilk biscuit topped with hollandaise sauce. Taste the famous coastal crab cakes at Jackson's Steakhouse in Pensacola. And sample local seafood at Capt. Anderson's Restaurant in Panama City Beach.
- Shopping Browse Grady Market on the historic waterfront in Apalachicola for a collection of over a dozen antiques shops, artist's galleries, and clothing and textile boutiques.
- Off the Beaten Path Experience the wild side of Northwest Florida: visit the beautiful Falling Waters State Park in Chipley, boasting Florida's highest waterfall and a 100-foot-deep sinkhole that has its own waterfall inside.



Escape to **South Walton**, a Northwest Florida haven boasting 26 miles of sugar-white sand beaches, turquoise waters, and 16 beachside neighborhoods, each with its own personality. Luxury accommodations, challenging golf courses, eclectic shops, funky art galleries, and award-winning dining give the area a distinctive character and relaxing atmosphere. Explore the great outdoors within four state parks, a state forest, 15 rare coastal dune lakes, and the Gulf of Mexico. South Walton: the perfect place to create memories that last a lifetime. THE FLORIDA KEYS & KEY WEST The islands of the Florida Keys make for a classic Florida vacation, with famous destinations such as Key Largo, Islamorada, and, of course, Key West.



Arts & Culture Explore the life of one of Key West's most famous residents at the Ernest Hemingway Home & Museum, where the celebrated author wrote much of his life's work. Afterwards, visit Heritage House Museum, site of the Robert Frost Cottage, where the poet stayed for 16 winters.



Fab Food Sip a fresh tropical fruit drink, sample conch (in a fritter or in ceviche), and keep an eye out for authentic key lime pie—yellow custard in a graham-cracker crust. Favorite Keys haunts include El Siboney Restaurant, a budget-friendly spot that serves up out-of-this-world Cuban cuisine, and Café Solé, known for its cozy ambience and innovative menu.

Shopping Whether you like it sweet, spicy, or nuclear-hot, you'll find something to light your fire at Peppers of Key West. Grab a seat at the Pepper Bar and sample the hundreds of sauces, salsas, and sweets.

→ Off the Beaten Path Get out your binoculars and look for osprey, flamingos, the magnificent frigate bird, and more at Dry Tortugas National Park—America's most inaccessible national park, reachable only by boat.




